Message from the President

I'm sure I say this every year - but is it June already!!! The sun has been shining on us lately so that must mean the end of the school year is in sight!!

The big news of late is that the K-12 Sector of CUPE BC has announced plans to open up bargaining early - by that I mean we have started preparing!! I am on the Provincial Bargaining Team - we met in Vancouver last week to fine tune the proposals put forth by the K-12 President's Council. Meetings with BCPSEA (British Columbia Public Sector Employers' Association) begin on Tuesday, June 5. I'm excited for the opportunity to bargain the best deal for everyone, along with a team of 16 other Local Presidents, Staff Reps, and Representatives from a few other unions who represent K-12 workers throughout the Province. The proposals were based on the results of the survey - Wages and Benefits being paramount for all sectors of K-12 followed by the modified work calendar. There are many Locals who do not get Pro-D days funded and are not given the opportunity to accumulate time for Spring Break so it ranked very high. I have not yet been given the survey results for our Local yet. As I stated, this is just the Provincial Framework we are working on right now (this includes wages, benefits, SSEAC funding, LIF, ESG Grant, to name a few) and I will be communicating with you before we begin local bargaining.

At this time about 30% of CUPE 947 has signed up, with their non-employer email, to receive updates on bargaining. I will send another email out this week with the link as I will not send information out to school district emails.

Our last general meeting for this school year is on Tuesday, June 5 and we will be celebrating our retiring CUPE 947 members. The meeting will be shortened so we can spend some time honoring our retirees. I will be in Vancouver but I know you'll be in good hands with Kerrie at the helm. Enjoy the rest of your school year!!!

Know Your Contract

17.13 The Staffing Process

(b) (ii) Employees can be allocated regular hours in job classifications that are equal to or lower than the classification they currently hold provided these classifications are within the same job stream. Human Resource Services will confirm the employee meets the qualifications of the added classifications prior to this assignment.

Current job streams are Clerical, Technical and Educational Assistant. It has been agreed that School Meals Assistant, Student Supervisor, School Assistant and Office Assistant hours can be added to any classification (regardless of job stream).

CUPE BC Convention 2018: A Newbie's Perspective

This past April I had the privilege of attending the CUPE BC Convention. It was an exciting and at times an overwhelming experience. Being new to the 947 board, I wasn't really sure what to expect. Of special interest was a speaker from Columbia who is the director of her country's human rights organization called NOMADESC. We, of CUPE BC, have proudly supported and continue to support her struggle in country for basic human rights for her citizens. Once I heard how people are treated in Columbia and the atrocities thrust upon them, I felt blessed to be a citizen of Canada.

A highlight for me was when our premier, John Horgan, spoke half way through the conference to thank CUPE for our support in the election. He was very articulate in his appreciation and was using very encouraging and positive language for the upcoming contract negotiations. As a matter of fact, his government has put forward the most positive language we have seen in over a 15 years when it comes to our negotiations. It has even moved talks up to begin many months early. All are a good signs for us in CUPE, especially after the dark years under the liberal government and their continuous cuts.

Are there a few things I would like to see done differently? Yes, I have suggestions. The format of the conference could be reviewed to see if there is a more efficient way to deal with all the business that needs to be done. Also, I feel there needs to be networking time built into the conference day outside of the social events when people really just want to relax. And finally, I think a better initial orientation for newbies like me needs to be added. I luckily went with others that had been in previous years. If I had been there on my own, I would have easily become lost and disoriented.

Overall, I found the experience was exhilarating, informative and energizing. I would recommend anyone who is interested in learning more about all the wonderful things our union does around the globe please attend our general meeting every other month. It will blow you away.


June 21 is National Aboriginal Day across Canada. Please check district and school websites for further information.
